MAJOR DUTIES:

To install, repair, and maintain electronic alarm systems, devices, various electrical systems, controls, and equipment.

Installs, maintains and repairs of electronic control devices, components, and systems in accordance with "Verband der Elektrotechnik Elektronik Informationstechnik e. V." (VDE) and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) rules and guidelines. Performs scheduled maintenance and testing on solid state electronic security and fire alarms, to include Fire Reporting System transmitter, detectors, power supplies, couplers etc. and alerting klaxons and sirens and entry control devices (cypher locks). Understands telephone communications circuitry and is able to perform maintenance and repair on alarm systems that use communication lines to transmit information when both multiplex and dedicated commune technology is used. Responds to equipment malfunctions. Uses written data, diagrams or locally made sketches and test circuits, solid state and digital components with equipment such as multimeters and oscilloscopes, signal tracers, logic probes and digital multimeters to perform effective repairs. Maintains and repairs installed electrical systems such as fire alarm systems; lighting fixtures and wiring; power fixtures and wiring; power sources; and/or services battery packs for emergency power systems. Locates broken, worn, damaged, or poorly operating wiring, controls, and equipment through visual checks or through use of a small variety of test equipment. Uses tools such as electronic detector testers, screwdrivers, pliers, wire cutters, strippers, drills, and soldering irons. In addition, uses a limited variety of test equipment, such as smoke/heat testers,

Uses computer controlled automatic test equipment; voltmeters, ohmmeters, growlers, resistance bridges, analyzer, depth/tension/spring gauges, micrometers, and dial indicators. Utilizes safety practices and procedures following established safety rules and regulations while maintaining a safe and clean work environment. Uses and assures proper fit of required safety equipment and clothing, etc.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS/QUALIFIZIERUNGSANFORDERUNGEN:

Education and Training Level IVb - State Certified Master Craftsman (f/m/d) in electronics field plus additional training in fire alarm technology

- Position required the ability to discern colors, contrast, and depth.
- Emergency overtime may be required.
- Will be required to train/guide lower grade (or other trades) military/civilian employees.
- Other physical requirements: Must stand, stoop, bend, kneel, climb, stretch, and work in tiring and uncomfortable positions.
